Location: University of New Hampshire 288 Mast Road, Durham, NH 03824

From July 9th through July 13th, CNER (Central New England Region) is offering a UL prep camp to assist UL riders in advancing their riding skills to the next level with the help of a very talented group of National Examiners from around the country. We expect a ratio of 4-6 riders to 1 clinician. The clinic will take place at the University of New Hampshire Equestrian Facility, which includes a large indoor arena, a dressage rings, outdoor jumping/flatting areas and a USEA sanctioned cross country course through Preliminary level.

All entries are accepted based on postmark, with preference given to CNER candidates **until May 30th**, after which time all applications will be accepted equally based on postmark. Applications will be accepted until the clinic is full.

Rather than coming as a sponge to absorb instruction, you should be prepared to say and show what you know. If during the clinic, you do not know something, the clinicians may tell you or they may ask you to look it up. Come prepared to work with your peers and polish yourself for your actual rating. For HA / H candidates – part of this clinic will include a mock test.

Please send, along with your check*, the attached CNER code of conduct, Current coggins **within 6 mos of camp, proof of vaccinations; Pony Club Medical Release Form, Code of Conduct and the Application data.**

**Because we run on a break-even basis, and to be fair to all attendees, refunds will not be given unless the space can be filled. No refunds can be made after June 30th.*

HORSES: Your horse should be fit to be ridden twice per day in 2 hour sessions. If your horse is not, please use your discretion in ending the sessions early. Your horse will be ridden as a ‘swap mount’ by the other participants within your sections, just as you will be allowed to ride theirs.

STALLS: Stalls are provided. Shavings are not. We are hoping to have use of tackroom stalls, depending on our numbers.

FOOD: Breakfast, Lunch and Snacks onsite. Dinner is on your own. Traditionally we will try to suggest a ‘meeting place’ for the evening, where ULs will tend to congregate for dinner.

CLINIC COSTS

Due to the very successful fund raising efforts of some of our UL members we are offering this camp at a very low cost. \$500 for CNE members and \$700 for all others. \$75 for stabling (this is equal to 2005 camp fees). The prices are based on a high number in attendance. The goal is to run the camp on a break even basis. If numbers are significantly lower than planned there may be additional costs for CNE members– not to exceed \$100.00. Should the program run significantly in the positive rebates will be sent.

\$500 camp fee for CNE members

\$700. camp fee for out of region

\$75.00 for stall (if bring more than 1 horse –send \$75.00 per horse)

\$25.00 refundable “clean stall” deposit

The stall deposit will be destroyed at the end of the session so long as your stall is left fully stripped
